

## **Pupil Premium Information**

National data consistently reveals that, as a group, pupils receiving free school meals make slower progress, resulting in lower attainment in their education than their peers who are not on free school meals.

In order to tackle this underachievement, reduce the progress gap and ensure that pupils of all groups have similar attainment and progress school are in receipt of Pupil Premium - a Government funded grant aimed at supporting these disadvantaged pupils.

The Levett School only receive Pupil Premium for pupils who are solely on the role of The Levett School (not dual registered with another school) at a census day. This means that, in actual terms, The Levett School only receives funding for a relatively small number of pupils, due to their referring school being allocated the funding in the first instance.

It is the responsibility of The Levett School to invoice the referring school throughout the school year to receive the funding. Historically, this has been a significant challenge, with schools being reluctant to forward the money owed.

In 2020/21 the Levett School is allocated the following funding for each pupil registered as eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last 6 years:

- £1,345 for pupils in reception to year 6
- £955 for pupils in year 7 to year 11

Levett School is allocated £2,345 for any pupil identified in the January 2020 school census or the alternative provision census as having left local-authority care as a result of one of the following:

- adoption
- a special guardianship order
- a child arrangements order (previously known as a residence order)
- who has been in local-authority care for 1 day or more
- recorded as both eligible for FSM in the last 6 years and as being looked after (or as having left local-authority care)

For the pupils who attract the £2,345 rate, the virtual school head of the local authority that looks after the pupil will manage the funding.

In 2019/20 Levett School accrued £52,853 in Pupil Premium. Please refer to the Levett School Pupil Premium Strategy Document, for details of expenditure.

## **PE (physical education) and sport premium funding**

In the financial year 2019/20, the Levett School received £8666 from PE (physical education) and sport premium funding.

This money provided age appropriate PE opportunities at the Lower site (primary).

Pupils at the Lower site benefitted from climbing from £11,355 and school purchasing a range of new PE equipment. The results included greater engagement in PE and a wider range of PE activities available to pupils, who, in turn benefitted from developing teamwork and social skills along with increased health and fitness. The cost of this was £5568.

In addition, classes received weekly swimming lessons at Adwick leisure centre, at a cost of £1485. Although expensive, swimming is an essential life-saving skill, which many families would not be able to afford to undertake. However, swimming also encourages our children to learn basic self-care routines, such as showering, dressing and hair brushing, which are transferrable to daily life.

### **Year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up premium funding**

In the financial year 2019/20, the Levett School received £1000 from the year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up premium funding.

This funding was allocated in the following ways: 2 staff undertook maths mastery training, at a cost of £70.00, to ensure that school had 2 maths experts. Following this maths manipulatives were purchased at a cost of £620.00, to ensure that our learners had access to a range of items that would enhance maths skills developed. All staff received training in use of manipulations white rose maths scheme was purchased at a cost of £165.00.
