Auto Adrenaline Injectors – Allergy declaration and consent

We are writing to bring your attention to some new guidance that school's will be required to follow, from September 2026.

The DfE will require all schools to stock a minimum of 1 spare Adrenaline Auto Injector (AAI) within school, to be available for use in emergencies where anaphylaxis occurs.

Anaphylaxis is a severe and rapidly developing allergic reaction that affects the whole body and is potentially life threatening.

As part of the new guidance, school's will be required to obtain consent annually from parent/carers regarding the admission of the spare AAI to their child, should circumstances require it.

We politely request that you complete the attached declaration form and return it to school to allow us to update our database. *Please be aware: the school will not stock the spare adrenaline auto injectors until September 2026.*

If your child has an allergy that may require the use of an AAI, parent/carers must provide the device to the school. It can either be stored at school or brought in by the pupil each day.

If you believe your child will no longer be on roll at The Levett School in September, we would ask that you still complete the form attached so we can ensure we have clear information surrounding any allergies for the remainder of their time with us.

We thank you for your co-operation with this matter.
