WHY ARE WE RECYCLING?

YOUR BINS

COLOUR CODED MEANINGS

RED = FOOD

If you can't eat it, it shouldn't be in there.

- Examples of correct items:
 - Orange peel
 - Banana skin
 - Left over school dinner
 - Tea bags

GREEN = RECYCLING

Examples of correct items:

- Empty CLEAN plastic/paper/cardboard food containers
- Empty CLEAN tins/cans/bottles

REMINDER: CLEAN ITEMS ONLY
& NO SHREDDED PAPER

BLUE = GENERAL WASTE

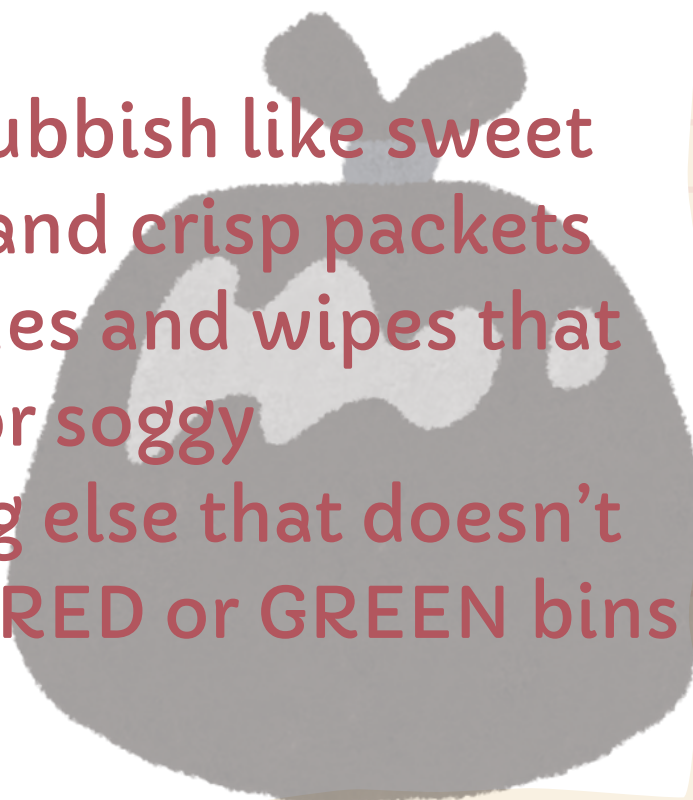
Anything and everything can go in here - but main items are anything that can't be recycled such as:

- Dirty food / drink containers
- Paper towels
- Tissues
- Leftovers still in packaging

TRY TO REMEMBER

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- R** – Raw food scraps
 - E** – Expired food
 - D** – Dinner leftovers

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- G** – Greeting cards and cardboard
 - R** – Recyclable paper
 - E** – Empty tins and cans
 - E** – Envelopes
 - N** – No food! Only clean, dry recyclables

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- B** – Broken bits that can't be recycled
 - L** – Leftover rubbish like sweet wrappers and crisp packets
 - U** – Used tissues and wipes that are dirty or soggy
 - E** – Everything else that doesn't belong in RED or GREEN bins
