- We are looking for parents of **young children (age 3-12 years)** with **neurodiversity** (e.g., autism spectrum disorder or ADHD).



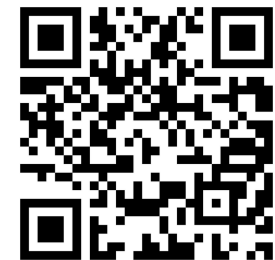
What is involved?
