In Primary, pupils have been completing autobiographies about their lives. Pupils planned, wrote, edited and published their work.





Boston Park Farm Visit

They enjoyed hearing about how the animals are cared for and helped feed them before enjoying a tractor ride.




THE YORKSHIRE WILDLIFE PARK CAREERS VISIT

It really has been one of the best residentials that we have had - a massive thanks to all the pupils and staff that made it so memorable!!




ANNUAL RESIDENTIAL
