


P-P-P-P PICK UP A PUMPKIN



DARTS









PUPIL SUCCESS STORIES

Well done, Alex-you've been amazing!






Jaidan has made an impressive transition back into mainstream education, demonstrating resilience and determination throughout the process.

SAFEGUARDING

As we approach the festive season, safeguarding remains a key priority in school. Over the past term, our pupils have taken part in a variety of interactive in-class safeguarding scenarios designed to help them understand how to keep themselves safe in different situations.

These sessions included short quizzes and discussions on:



Fire drills and lockdown procedures

 Understanding what to do in an emergency and why following instructions quickly keeps everyone safe.



• Learning how to enjoy fireworks responsibly and avoid accidents.

Halloween safety

 Staying visible, walking safely with friends, and making safe choices while trick-or-treating.

Online safety

• Including safe posting, understanding who to trust online, and specific guidance on platforms such as Roblox.

Dark nights

 Tips for keeping safe when it gets darker earlier, including walking in well-lit areas, wearing bright clothing, and always letting a trusted adult know where you are.

These activities have helped children understand how to make safe choices, protect themselves and know when to ask for help. They have also encouraged discussions about feelings and safe ways to express concerns, which are just as important as knowing the practical steps to stay safe.

We also recognise that Christmas can be a wonderful, joyful time but it can also be a difficult period for some children and families. Changes in routine, family stresses and busy schedules can sometimes be overwhelming.

It is important to remember that if any families have concerns, issues, or difficulties during this time, please do not hesitate to contact a member of the safeguarding team or another staff member you feel comfortable speaking with.

Our school is here to support both pupils and families, ensuring that everyone can enjoy the festive season safely and with confidence. Remember, safeguarding is not just about rules—it's about making sure everyone feels safe, supported, and able to thrive.
